RESIDENCY PROGRAMS

Fees for residency programs vary according to your organization's needs, and additional programs are available upon request.

COMMUNITY LEVEL

These programs include informal performances for senior citizen center, hospitals, libraries, churches and community centers. A key element of these presentations is creating a connection with the audience through speaking about music.

ELEMENTARY LEVEL

What is this Thing Called the Guitar? Introduces young people to the classical guitar's construction and music.

SECONDARY LEVEL

Music of the Ages illuminates the variety of music written for the guitar from the Renaissance to the present day.

Music of the Americas presents the diverse classical guitar music of North America, South America and the Caribbean, with much discussion about distinguishing characteristics of this music.

Music of the World provides a sampling of classical guitar music from many different countries, with discussion about distinguishing characteristics of this music.

Guitar Workshops and Masterclass covers technique issues and musical interpretation for music students, and is adaptable to the needs of the school. Ensemble coaching is also available in these demonstrations.

COLLEGE LEVEL

Many of the above listed topics relevant to secondary schools can also be adapted to fit the interests of college level students. These presentations are available for a wide variety of subjects including guitar class, music appreciation, music theory music appreciation and music history students.
